

Selective Androgen Receptor Modulators (SARMs) are a growing threat to Australian athletes. SARMs can often look like normal supplements and examples include Ligandrol (LGD-4033), Testolone/radarine (RAD-140), Andarine, and Ostarine (Enobosarm).

They are advertised heavily across social media and claim to act like steroids, but without any side effects.

Don't be fooled.



- Claim to build muscle and bone density
- Claim to have no steroid-like side effects
- Appear to be manufactured in scientific labs



- Are banned in all sport
- Have not undergone clinical trials
- Are not approved for human use
- Can be manufactured in backyard labs
- Are linked to liver failure
- Increase risk of heart attack or stroke

SARMs are now the most commonly detected performance enhancing drug in Australian sport.

Don't risk it.
